Johannesburg, Apartheid Museum Tour *(Half Day, Private)*

This tour provides a great opportunity to take a closer look at South Africa's turbulent past, by combining a drive through Soweto with a visit to the Apartheid Museum, regarded as the pre-eminent museum in the world dealing with 20th-century South Africa, at the heart of which is the story of apartheid. The museum opened its doors in 2001. Here you will embark on a historical voyage of discovery, a personal exploration of the past that examines apartheid right up to the first democratic elections held in 1994. The tour of the museum lasts approximately two hours. We then continue to Soweto, a sprawling residential area that has become a "city within a city." Soweto is home to approximately two million people, many of whom work in various parts of the greater Johannesburg metropolitan area. We follow a route that takes us past all the major points of interest, including the Chris Hani Baragwanath Hospital, Baragwanath taxi rank, Regina Mundi church, Hector Pieterse Memorial, and Nelson Mandela's former home.

Johannesburg & Soweto Orientation Tour *(Half Day, Private)*

This tour is perfect for first-time visitors to South Africa's commercial and financial capital—Johannesburg. Aptly named “the City of Gold,” its origins stretch back to 1886 when gold was discovered in the area. Now the city is known amongst locals as Egoli, Jozi, or Jo’burg and has a rich and vibrant past and present. Our route covers all the major points of interest, from Sandton in the north to Soweto in the south. You can expect to drive through Rosebank and Houghton, the latter being Nelson Mandela’s current home. In Braamfontein you will see the Constitutional Court of South Africa and further downtown the City Hall, Diagonal Street, Newtown, and Nelson Mandela Bridge. At the iconic Carlton Centre, we see the city from the “Top of Africa” in the enclosed viewing deck fifty floors up. We continue past the Chris Hani Baragwanath Hospital and Regina Mundi Catholic church and then visit the Hector Pieterse Memorial before making our way to Vilakazi Street, site of Nelson Mandela’s former home and Bishop Desmond Tutu’s home.

[Kapama River Lodge](#)

Within the expansive Kapama Private Game Reserve, River Lodge epitomizes five-star safari accommodation. The majestic northern Drakensberg Mountains form the backdrop to the 64-suite River Lodge, which is positioned along a bend of the seasonal Kapama River. It is the largest luxury game lodge in the Greater Kruger National Park area, and is stylishly furnished to ensure an unforgettable African safari experience. African artefacts adorn the lounges of River Lodge, and a palate of red and gold reflects the colours of Africa's earth. Glass stack doors open onto the rim-flow pool to create an al fresco experience. The long, L-shaped lounge and bar, under double-volume thatch, follow the line of the pool to create an airy but cosy atmosphere. In winter, a double-sided fireplace provides additional warmth.

As in classic old Africa, evening meals are often enjoyed seated around a roaring fire in the Rhino Boma. Here, buffet meals are served under open-sided thatch and showcase pan-African dishes prepared from fresh local ingredients. Traditional venison dishes also feature on this authentic African menu. Romantic dining is epitomised by dinner set in the dry riverbed in front of the lodge, under a star-studded African night sky. The experience adds enchantment to any African luxury safari experience. The Siyatla Lounge is purpose-built as an enclosed dining area, where breakfasts and lunches are served. It has its own bar and lounge with two large fireplaces, while glass stack doors open up the lounge to the surrounding bushveld.

[Southern Sun The Cullinan](#)

A well-known landmark in the Cape Town CBD, Southern Sun The Cullinan brings guests all the luxury that is expected of an award-winning hotel from Tsogo Sun. The hotel is situated within one of the most sought-after areas in the city – within easy reach of the V&A Waterfront, Cape Town International Convention Centre, Long Street and many other attractions. But while its location is without a doubt envious, it is only the start of what makes this hotel an iconic place to stay. Classic style with an opulent twist ensures that every need is met, while a variety of world-class facilities add even more to the sense of indulgence. Whether you are travelling on business or pleasure, you may not ever wish to leave your sumptuous home-from-home.

Cape Town, Jewish Museum & Table Mountain Tour *(Full Day, Private)*

We visit the Jewish Museum for three hours before moving on to Table Mountain. The first stop is Table Mountain's Lower Cableway Station, for a 5-minute revolving cable car ride to the top. We will explore the mountain's summit and absorb the breathtaking views before descending. Table Mountain Aerial Cableway has something for everyone, which is why it has attracted more than 23-million visitors since its opening in 1929. Take the five-minute cable car trip to the top of Table Mountain, 1 089 metres above Cape Town, and explore the summit. (The Cableway is wheelchair accessible, and yes, some parts at the top are too.) This is a great spot to sit and soak up the commanding 360-degree views of Cape Town, Table Bay, the nearby peaks of the surrounding mountains and the rest of the Table Mountain National Park, in which the Cableway is situated. Hit one of three hiking trails that start at the Upper Cable Station and explore the summit further. Table Mountain is part of a World Heritage Site, an important part of the Cape Floristic Region and the single richest floristic area in the world. There is a lot of fynbos vegetation on the mountain, with over 1,460 different species of plants. There are also plenty of dassies, lizards, insects and birdlife to be seen.

Cape Town, Winelands Tour *(Full Day, Private)*

We depart the city for the Winelands, where we visit wine estates according to your preferences. These areas generally include the region's major wine producing areas of Stellenbosch, Paarl and Franschhoek, and there are chances aplenty, en route, for tastings of world-renowned reds and whites, as well as Cap Classiques – South Africa's answer to "Champagne". On our journey we lunch at one of the many classic award-winning restaurants in the area. On your tour you will not fail to notice the natural and historic heritage which abounds. You may take in sights like the Afrikaans Language Monument with its panoramic Boland views, the historic estate of Boschendal with its beautifully preserved Cape Dutch buildings and priceless period furniture, and idyllic Franschhoek, nestled in a valley settled by French Huguenots in 1688. Franschhoek is a delight for antique lovers and gastronomes (the town boasts some world-famous eateries), while Stellenbosch, South Africa's second-oldest town, provides another glimpse of classic 17th-century Cape style, with a chance to browse quaint Dorp Street and the many museums, galleries and shops of this lovely university town. You will enjoy cheese-tasting at Fairview and chocolate-tasting at Spice Route. As time and interest allows, we may make a special stop at the art studio of one of South Africa's best-known artists at Lourensford Winery in Somerset West. *Please note that the route may vary depending on the pick-up and drop-off points as well as inclusions and entrances may vary for guests to pay directly depending on what has been included.*

Cape Town, Robben Island Tour (*Half Day, Unaccompanied*)

Depart from Cape Town's Victoria & Alfred Waterfront by ferry for a scenic 25-minute trip across Table Bay to Robben Island (also called Seal Island). This World Heritage Site, which is one of South Africa's most revered national monuments, was once a prison. Among its more famous inmates was the 19th-century tribal chief, Makana, who lost his life attempting to escape by boat across the bay, and South Africa's first democratically elected president, Nelson Mandela. He spent two decades of his life on the island, along with some 3 000 other political detainees, many of whom were icons of the resistance and became leaders of the new South Africa. This stirring tour is led by experienced island guides (some of whom were once inmates) and includes a visit to the Prison Block and the infamous Limestone Quarry, where prisoners toiled, as well as a drive around the island. *Please note that your driver/guide will drop you off at the ferry terminal of Robben Island and collect you afterwards, and the tour is subject to weather conditions.*

Cape Town, Peninsula Tour *(Full Day, Private)*

We make our way along the Atlantic seaboard passing Sea Point, Bantry Bay and Clifton. Bakoven and Llandudno, with their ghostly shipwrecks, are also fantastic sights on the way to the fishing village of Hout Bay, where we board a boat to view the Cape Fur Seal colony on Duiker Island (weather permitting). From here we navigate the 114 curves of 600m high Chapman's Peak Drive. We then explore the Cape of Good Hope section of the Table Mountain National Park, home to fabulous birds and very special fauna, such as Cape mountain zebra, bontebok and the charismatic Cape baboon. Climb (or ride the world's first environmentally friendly funicular) to the famous Cape Point Lighthouse to capture the magical vistas of False Bay. After lunch, head home through the naval village of Simonstown and over scenic Boyes Drive, taking in the views of the fishing harbour at Kalk Bay and the seaside havens of St James and Muizenberg. We also visit Boulders Beach to see its famous penguin colony. *Please note that the route may vary depending on the pick-up and drop-off points as well as inclusions and entrances may vary for guests to pay directly depending on what has been included.*

[Kariega Settlers Drift](#)

Located in a remote and untouched part of the Kariega wilderness, Settlers Drift offers a unique tented safari combined with 5-star luxury. The lodge consists of nine spacious tented suites, each with stunning views and secluded viewing decks. Gazing down from the decks overlooking the Bushman's River, it feels as if time has stood still since the last feet to have touched this remote valley were those of the 1820 Settlers as they guided their wagons across the river. The luxuriously appointed and perfectly positioned tented lodge delivers the ultimate guest experience.

Kariega Game Reserve is a family-owned and operated private game reserve in South Africa stretching across 10,000 hectares of pristine wilderness in the Eastern Cape. The Reserve is situated along the famous Garden Route, making it the perfect Big 5 South African safari destination to compliment a Cape Town visit and a trip along the country's beautiful coast. This malaria-free South African game park is home to some of the richest biodiversity in Southern Africa, as well as two abundant rivers – the picturesque Kariega and Bushman's Rivers. It's your once in a lifetime choice for safaris South Africa!

Two beautiful rivers make this game reserve in South Africa completely unique. Guests can complement their safari experience with a boat cruise down the Kariega River sighting abundant river birdlife, or take a kayak onto the river for a quiet paddle. In the evenings, relax and sit back with a sundowner to simply enjoy the tranquil sights and sounds of river life within this unique game park in South Africa.

Kariega Game Reserve in South Africa is a 10 minute drive from the sleepy coastal village of Kenton-on-Sea, and a mere 140 km outside of Port Elizabeth, making it a perfectly accessible game park in South Africa and ideally situated near the coast.





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
